Top Right Stamp: £1.55, 007. Machine guns, Flamethrowers, Aerial mines, Rockets. Little Nellie, *You Only Live Twice*.

Bottom Left Stamp: 15p, 007. Thrust 136kgf, Max. speed 34mph, Max. flight 21 seconds, Max. altitude 18m. Bell-Textron Jet Pack, *Thunderball*.

Bottom Right Stamp: 15p, 007. Radar tracking, Bulletproof shield, Rear smoke screen, Oil slick release. Aston Martin DB5, *Skyfall*.

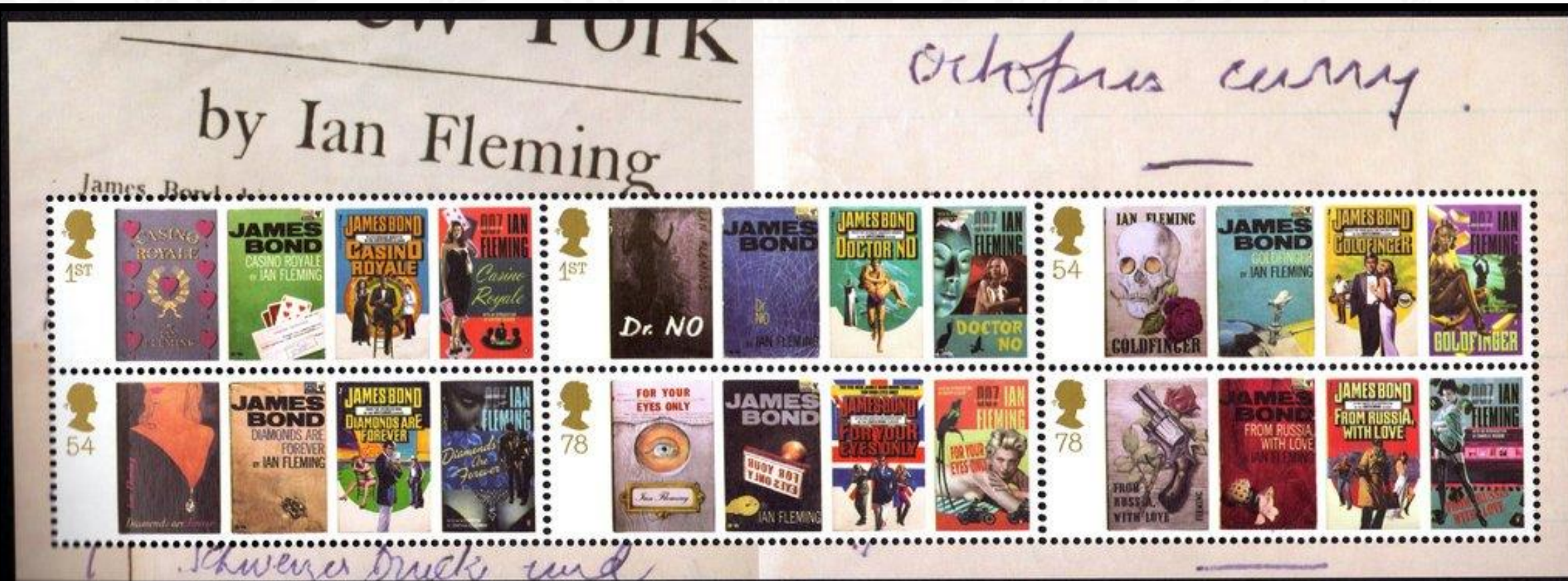
